In flagrante delicto or sometimes simply *in flagrante* (Latin: "while [the crime] is blazing") is a legal term used to indicate that a criminal has been caught in the act of committing an offense (compare <u>corpus delicti</u>). The <u>colloquial</u> "caught <u>red-handed</u>" or "caught in the act" are English equivalents.

The Latin term has come to be used far more often as a <u>euphemism</u> for a couple being caught in the act of <u>sexual intercourse</u>; in modern usage the intercourse need not be <u>adulterous</u> or illicit.
